Buford J. Poe, formerly of Fort Smith, died Tuesday, Oct. 25, 2005, at Park Centre in Newton, Iowa.

Buford Poe was born Jan. 27, 1913, to Alfred Caleb Poe and Mary Ethel Park Poe of

In retirement, he spent his best days on his boyhood farm watching his Hereford cattle grow and mature.

Because of declining health, Buford moved to Newton, Iowa, to be near his son John in 2003. Buford is survived by his children, John and spouse, Sylvia of Chariton, Iowa, Rebecca and her spouse, Jim Townsend of Maitland, Fla.; his daughter-in-law, Charlotte Poe of Evans, Ga.; seven grandchildren; and four great-grandsons. He was

preceded in death by his wife of 64 years, Rutha; his son Bill Poe; his parents; his sister, Daisy Hamilton; and his brothers, Donald, Sam and Willie Poe.
