



OLD BELFAST

ON THIS SITE STOOD THE PIONEER VILLAGE OF BELFAST, SETTLED ABOUT THE YEAR 1850 WHILE THIS AREA WAS A PART OF SALINE COUNTY. BELFAST WAS A STAGE STOP ON THE ROAD FROM CAMDEN TO LITTLE ROCK. ALONG THIS ROAD THE RETREATING FEDERAL ARMY PASSED IN 1864 FOLLOWING THE BATTLE OF JENKINS' FERRY.
