 Wintrud Johnson wife of Willie Johnson
 one Negro boy named Handy, now in their
 possession, to her & her heirs forever,
 Item, I give & bequeath unto my beloved
 Son Benjamin Carrill one Negro girl
 named Lanny, now in his possession, to him & his
 heirs forever
 Item, I give and bequeath unto my beloved Son
 Matthew Carrill Two Hundred acres of Land
 lying in said County on the waters of Middle Creek

to be taken off the South end a part of a tract of
 Land I purchased of Jonathan Auster, one Negro
 boy by the name of Frank, one boy Selley, my new
 Saddle to him, his Whig (papers) for ever, ^{one} ~~one~~

 Item, I give and bequeath unto my beloved Son Merit
 Carrell Two Hundred of Twenty five acres
 of Land, being the remaining part of the aforesaid

 part of which I have given to my son Matthew Carrell
 Two Hundred acres, two Negro boys named Jo and
 Abram, to him, his Whig (papers) for ever, ^{one} ~~one~~

 Item, I give and bequeath unto my beloved Son Peter
 Carrell, the Land of plantation whereon I
 now live containing about Three Hundred acres
 also one small part of Land I have lying on Swift

 of Drury Johnson of Starter Johnson, two Negro boys
 named, Bob & Charles, one feather bed ~~bedstead~~ and
