Uncle Everett and Aunt Jem., had been married 3 months, and were sitting at the supper table, when John Wilson shot him, robbed him of his money (he had just sold 18 bales of cotton that day) his gold watch, went to the barn and shot his saddle horse, this was in 1867.

John Wilson claimed to be in love with Aunt Jem., even though he was a married man, and had told her if she married Everett Gentry, he would see that she didn't live with him.

Aunt Jemima, Mother was Maria
Nall Shepherd, ^{wife of Jacob Shepherd}, a first Cousin of
John Wilson wife Pennimah E. Nall.

John Wilson operated a store
near Jacob Shepherd's home, and
kept his horse in Shepherd's barn.

On the night of May 5, 1873, Jacob
Shepherd locked all his doors told
his family not to leave the house.

Aunt Jemima told John Wilson she
would meet him that night, which
she did not do. When he went out
to meet Aunt Jemima, he was killed
with a volley of shots. My mother-in-law
was 13 yrs of age at this time. She heard
she and her older sister tell ~~about~~ about
their father locking the doors, and them
hearing the volley of shots.

Pennimah E. Nall Wilson married
2nd time John Brown Sept 8, 1874
after he died, she married Judge
Bedford Williams in 1880.
She burned her fingers every time
she married, so I've been told.
