There is 11 pages of the will of O. P. Poe. I  
suppose that would be Oliver Perry on file in  
Fayette Co. Courthouse. I'll look into that  
when we go to Fayette next week end for  
Buren (my husband) to squirrel hunt. I will  
also see what I can find on John Poe Sr.  
Maybe I'll find him in land grant records

When I was searching Fayette Co. records  
in July, I found Simon Poe to Gately Poe Lucas  
Dec. 2-1830. Vol 4 - Page 392.

R. H. Poe to Bradley Nall Jan. 25-1849 - Vol 4. P. 159  
Bradley Nall 560 acres land to R. H. Poe Feb. 12-1849  
Vol 4. P. 160

I just copied a few.

From Track book Fayette Co.  
Simon Poe entered land in 1824-1832

a few miles to the Concord Community. We  
want to search tombstone inscriptions  
in Concord Cemetery also.

I found in our public library recently  
in one of Mrs. Saunders Ala records, Vol  
50, a record of old Bethel Church  
organised in 1818 on the Warrior river  
about 8 mi from the present Tuscaloosa  
Everett Yerby <sup>B. 1762</sup> and wife ~~Rachel~~ Sarah B. 1766  
Larkin Poe and wife Rachel were

his wife a few yrs. later - Larkin Poe D. 1834  
I believe these yerbys were my ggg. grandparents  
some of their descendants settled in Fayette Co.  
since Tradition says that Hogan yerby. Came  
to Ala. from N.C. with Simon Pol and other  
pioneer families, I believe this Larkin Poe  
was an ancestor to Fayette Co pois.
