Dear Mr. Walton,

I have collected a lot of Poe data since I wrote you, but have not been able to fit it all together yet.

I went to Fayette Ala. for a W.P. visited friends and relatives, elderly people, and old cemeteries and searched records at Court house. Most every one that works at the Court house is an old friend or relative. The County Solicitor Louis Moore is my second cousin (on my father's side) his father was the late Judge James Moore. Louis Moore's mother is Stella Poe Moore, a descendant of James Poe B. 1794. M. Mary McMillian. James Poe was a brother to our Simon Poe B. 1782.

Stella Poe Moore has a lot of data on Poets. She received from Mrs. Ruby McMillian of Lisbon Ohio. I read all these letters she had received from Mrs. McMillian. I learned she had also contacted you several yrs ago.

Burn (my husband) and I visited this old Poe Cemetery. But it has been a cow pasture for a good many yrs. It has grown up in bushes and briars. But we did ~~not~~ find the monument with writing on it. We found several plain

rock for monument. Later I talked with Stella Poe Moore. She said she visited this farm and cemetery in 1932-33. She said the tenants who lived on the farm had used the flat rock monuments for stepping stones in their yard and the old white monument was broken up and the pieces lying under the edge of the front door step. She said she copied down some of the writings but couldn't remember what it said and her son had her notes at his home. I hope she can find it.

I have some more data on Edgar Allan Poe family, that I didn't have when I wrote you

The genealogist Mrs. Carter in Washington D.C. found our Yorks-Shephards, Poës living in same community in Anson Co N.C. in 1800-10-20 Census. and the Hall families just across the line in Montgomery Co.

We have been able to fit the Poës in better than the Shephards, and Yorks - because

We don't know the name of Jacob and Isaac Shephard's father. She found Jacob, Isaac, Wm, and Robert Shephard which are family names -

Wat Roe settled in Tuscaloosa Co - just across the river from Newtomville - I believe Major James Roe's sons - were Simon | Simon Roe B. 1782 married James twice, I believe the first wife was Thomas the mother of his children. Wat his last wife was lots younger John - than himself, her name was Dicy, according to Simon Roe's Will.

The above Martin Nall and his wife Mary (Polly) ann Roe Nall - were the great grand parents of my husband also the great grand parents of Miss Matilda Shepherd of Sheridan Ark.

In searching old records and Wills I find that sometimes all the children aren't mentioned - For instance I found on record at Fayette Settlement of Martin Nall Estate in 1851,

Martin died in 1834. Only two of his children were mentioned - Mary (Polly) (named after her mother) wife of James T. Poe (who was later a judge in Ark.) and Alexander Hall who was a minor. John W. Poe husband of Louisa Hall was Alexander Hall's guardian.

Martin Hall had 3 other children, Mariah, Nathan, and Dorothea (Dolly). I wrote the Harry T. Poe in Greenville S.C. But have never heard from him.

I went to Montgomery Ala. this past wkend to visit the Archives Dept. Not knowing it was closed on wkends and all holidays, I'll have to try again.

I hope we can get these older Poës straightened out. Several people I know are helping.

I found the deed you found recorded in Ark. from Simon Poë to his son - Hately Poë Lucas. We also found a record of a deed gift of a bunch of Negro slaves to Hately Poë Lucas from her father Simon Poë in 1850.

There is a young man in his early thirties here in Birmingham by name of Emmitt Lucas - that spent 3 yrs. working full time on Lucas, Dodson, family history, then an copies of his book in Birmingham and Fayette libraries. My mothers grandmother was a member of this Dodson family, Wm. Dodson and wife Sara Pyles Dodson settled in Tuscaloosa Co. in 1818. later moved to Fayette Co. They had 16 children.

wm Dodson family has been traced back to 1649
 in England Sara Pyle Pyles family to 1610 in
 Wales. The Lucas and Dodson families
 Married and intermarried so much is the reason
 they were written up together. There is a lot of
 data on other connecting families.

I copied the above data from the Lucas, Dodson
 history. The descendants of the above are also in
 this book. I was in a hurry when I copied
 this I didn't take down birthdates of any except
 Warren, because I knew the name of your
 ancestor was Warren.

My husband has been busy at night drawing
 lines and sections of Newtomill in Fayette Co.
 to see where the first settlers lived and owned
 land. We found Cornelius, Charles, and Warren
 Holliman owned land in Newtomill in 1836

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which joined Hogan Verby (My g g grandfather)
 property. Near Simon Poe B 1782. and Isaac Shepherd
 B. 1800. Uriah Holliman was probably a
 son or younger brother of the B Hollimans
 that entered land in Newtownville. When
 I have more time at the Library I mean
 to check and see if Thomas Lucas ~~was~~
 that Mr. Gatsy Poe was a member of the
 above mentioned ^{Lucas} family. I havent
 tried to contact Cecil Holliman the attorney
 he is prominent in Republican Circles
 here, and he has been very busy lately
 He has an Uncle Wm. Baker that married
 Ida Verby a Cousin to my Mother. She is also
 a first Cousin to my Husband on the Shepherd
 side, they live in Newtownville in Fayette Co.

There's a Will on record in Fayette of Turner Threat
 But I forgot to look it up.

I want to go to Tuscaloosa Ala. and
 search records.
