for yrs. But has been Missionary  
Baptist 75. yrs or longer.  
I finally received a letter

from Mary Livingstone dau.  
about 2 wks ago. But she  
did not tell me any more about  
the Poos than I already knew.

I went back to N.C. again  
last yr. and did a lot of research in  
Muskleburg, Union and Anson  
Cos. and found so much data I  
didn't have time to write it all  
down. I found your John Poe living  
near May James Poe. according to deed  
records. I copied a good many  
deed records of all the Poos that  
settled in Fayette and Tuscaloosa Cos  
Ala. It seemed that John Poe  
sold all his land in 1821.  
so he must have come to Ala  
about 1822. I never did get  
the 1820 Census on John Poe of  
Anson Co N.C. Mrs. Carter just  
sent me his name. I mean to  
try to get it yet. I hope to go back  
to N.C. to the Plyler reunion June  
24<sup>th</sup>. this yr. and do a lot  
more research. I have several
