visit and work on genealogy. I'm planning on
my trip to N.C. in about six wks. We
hope to visit you people too. Some time
this summer - I'm anxious to know
what you think about the poe material

from the only monument in the old Poe country
on the Simon Poe farm at Newtomble -

Simon Poe Born 1782. Died 1875.
