Uncle Everett and Aunt Jenn, had been married 3 months, and were sitting at the supper table, when John Wilson shot him, robbed him of his money. (he had just sold 18 bales of cotton that day) his gold watch, went to the barn and shot his saddle horse, this was in 1867.

John Wilson claimed to be in love with Aunt Jenn, even though he was a married man, and had told her if she married Everett Yerby, he would see that she didn't live with him.

Aunt Jenns, Mother was Mariah  
Nall Shepherd. <sup>wife of Jacob Shepherd.</sup> a first Cousin of  
John Wilsons wife Peninah E. Nall.

John Wilson operated a store  
near Jacob Shepherds home. and  
kept his horse in Shepherds barn.

on the night of May 5. 1873. Jacob  
Shepherd locked all his doors told  
his family not to leave the house.

Aunt Jenns, told John Wilson she  
would meet him, that night. which  
she did not do. when he went out  
to meet Aunt Jenns, he was killed  
with a volly of shots. my mother in law  
was 13 yrs of age at this time. I've heard  
she and her elder sisters tell ~~me~~ about  
their father locking the doors. and them  
hearing the volly of shots -

Peninah E. Nall Wilson married  
2nd time John Brown Sept 8. 1874  
after he died, she married Judge  
Bedford Williams in 1880.  
she Buttered her fingers every time  
she married, so I've been told
