When I was searching Fayette Co. records in July, I found Simon Poe to Gatesy Poe Lucas Dec. 2-1830. Vol 6- Page 392-

Bradley Nall 360 acres land to R.H. Poe Feb. 12-1849
Vol 6. P. 160

I just copied a few.

when we go to Fayette next week. I'll
see what I can find on the Roes.

The Roes left the Newtomville Community
 yrs ago. Moved just across the Ripsyrine
& few miles to the Concord Community. We
 want to search limestone inscriptions

I found in our Public Library recently
 in one of Mrs. Garrels' Alabama records, Vol
 D, a record of old Bethel Church
 Organised in 1818 on the Warrior River
 about 8 mi from the present Tuscaloosa.
 Everett Yerby ^{B 1762} and wife ~~Sarah~~ ^{B 1766}
 Larkin Roe and wife Rachel were

Charter Members - Everett Yerby D. 1823.
his wife a few yrs. later - Larkin Poe D. 1834
I believe these Yerby's were my ggg. grandparents
some of their descendants settled in Fayette Co.
Since Tradition says that Hogan Yerby, came
to Ala. from N.C. with Simon Poe and other
Pioneer families, I believe this Larkin Poe
was ancestor to Fayette Co poe's.
