James Hogg served on Com. of safety of Orange Co., N.C. and in Provincial Congress. Born in Scotland, emigrated to N.C. 1774 and died in Hillsboro in 1805. (He would not be the father of Ezekiel and Hiram Hogue but could be the grandfather). (When we were in N.C. this summer we heard of Hogues in and around Orange Co., N.C. and were told to see them but did not have time. They spelled their name as Hogue, the same as ours).

In 1630 census S.C. could Ezekiel Hogge, 20-30 have been a son of Daniel Hogge, 50-60, and Daniel a son of James 70-80 ? When we go to Washington I want to try to locate the Hogue family in Tenn. probably Davidson Co. Perhaps one of the older Hogues went with Ezekiel and Hiram Hogue to Tenn. from S.C.

Isaac Hogue mar. Charlay Nichole, went to S.C. Will of Nathan Nichole probated Feb. 14, 1791, Loudon Co., Va. names Isaac Hogue as "son-in-law".

"I find upon referring to my files that I returned to Mrs. Hatch the data she sent me several years ago regarding her James Hogue. If you think your ancestors had any connection with that James Hogue, I am afraid I cannot help you much as I find that I told Mrs. Hatch the same when I returned her data.

One or two of the sons of William Hogue (the immigrant who married Barbara Hume) moved South, but the only Hoge historian of the Penna. & Va. branch that I know of, did not have any data on those that moved South. William Hogue had 11 or 12 children. One that moved South was named George. There were other Hogg, Hoge families in Va. ~~by~~ that time and I have read as to how some of them moved south.

You will note from the enclosed extract from the first U.S. Census (1790) for N.C. that there were several there in N.C. 1790. Contrary to your supposition, I have never spent much money in my tracing, but have spent a lot of time.

If you do not already have a copy, you might be interested in obtaining a copy of "The Family of Hoge" compiled by James Hogue Tyler who was at one time attorney for the Vick's Co. of Greensboro, N.C.

I obtained a copy of it in 1940 for \$4.00 from Rogers, Hoge and Hills,
41 East 42nd St., N. Y. city.
It has a sketch of the Hoge coat of arms which closely resembles two or three other copies I have seen.

The following is copied from a letter dated 2-17-'42 from Mrs. Walter (Caroline B.) Fulghum, 205 Hines Terrace, Macon, Ga. ...
'A George Hoge or Hogue was living in Savannah, Ga. in 1752. I am sure he was the father of grandfather of Jacob Hoge of Georgia. He, Jacob sold land in Prince Edward Co., Va. in 1786, was living in Wilks Co., Georgia at the time'.
This George was probably the son of Wm. the immigrant, who moved South.

The following from a letter by Mrs. Geo. Head, (4-19-'43)
120 Highland Ave., LaGrange, Ga. ...
'Jacob Hogue is said to have been a son of James Hogue (the son of William the immigrant) who was born 1706. The names of 4 of his children are missing on page 39 in the 'Family of Hoge'.
Mrs. Head says she is the gr-gr-granddaughter of Jacob.
Mathew Hogue of Green Co., Ala. could have been another of the missing children of James Hogue.

I have a copy of Mathew's will dated Sept. 16, 1840. The names of his children were: James, Jane Meador, Mary Sanford, Nancy, Wiley J., Henry C., John W., Jeter Anson.

I don't feel that the above is worth anything to you, but am glad to pass it on as so many have helped me."

Dear Mr. Hogue:

You have had to wait a long time for an answer to your letter from my sister, Miss Inez, of Monmouth, Ill. I met her in Chicago a month ago and she gave me your letter and asked me to answer it, as I have the book "The Family of Hoge", compiled by John Hogue Tyler.

I intended to write to you on my return home but just have not found the time until now. I am afraid that we cannot be of much assistance to you in tracing your family history.

We seem to be a separate branch of the Hogues. Our history runs something as follows: In 1745 three brothers, Peter, Thomas and James Hoge came from Bernyside, Scotland and landed in Alexandria, Virginia. Thomas was soon eliminated, killed by the Indians. Peter became very prominent in early Virginia history. He was a friend of Geo. Washington, and a Captain of the Militia under Gov. Dinwiddie. When I was in Richmond, Va. a few years ago, I found in the State Library a good many references to Peter. He was also a soldier in the Rev. War and was given a tract of 2000 acres of land somewhere in the Ohio Valley.

Our ancestor, James, who seemed to be a rather restless individual, as he soon moved from eastern Va. to the Shenandoah Valley, later to Maryville, Tenn. We found his will at the court house there, which was witnessed by one of Gen. Sam Houston's brothers. From there he moved to Southern Indiana. After his death, his son, our grandfather, Alexander Hogue moved to Monmouth, Ill. As far as we know, we were not connected with the Hogues around Zanesville, Ohio, but may be related to those around Washington, Pennsylvania.

Miss Gertrude Hogue of Hanover, Ind. is mistaken about our having lived in Zanesville, O. The family name is spelled Hogg, Hoge, later Hogue.

Bernyside, Scotland is in the neighborhood of Sir Walter Scott's home where the Ettrick Shepherd poet, James Hogg lived and also the birthplace of Gen. Haig. When I was in Scotland five years ago I visited that neighborhood and the tomb of Gen. Haig. There is a possibility that the name had a common origin, which was supposed to be northwestern France. There are still Hogues living in that part of France.

(Note from Mrs. Hatch - "This filled the page of his letter, and since his name, etc. were at the top, guess he thought he didn't need to take another page just to put his name on. In over two years search we have not found this James Hogue to be our ancestor). Mrs. Hatch is a descendent of James Hogue of Pennsylvania.

Will Book A. 1835 to 1855.

Hogge, William. The following is the last Will and testament of
William Hogge, deceased.

"I William Hogge, being of sound and perfect mind and memory
do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and
form following.

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Nancy Hogge
the tract of land whereon I now live containing 140 acres or so much
of it as will be a competency for a complete support during her
natural life. I do also give unto her all my stock consisting of
two gray mares, hogs and cattle and shop exc 3 steers together
with all my farming utintials, household and kitchen furniture
also my present crop of corn, tobacco and cotton. Also all my
money, notes or bank accounts all of which she is to exercise owner-
ship over after paying all my just debts during her natural life live.

Second I do also will and bequest unto my two youngest sons
Hiram Hogge and Edward H. Hogge the above named tract of land together
with all the above named property with its increase or so much as
remains undisposed of for the maintenance of my wife and payment of
my debts and the said Hiram and Edward Harvey is to be equal shares made.

I do hereby appoint Ezekiel Hogge and Samuel Watson my
executors of this my last will and testament revoking all former
wills by me made.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my seal this 23rd day of October 1853.

This lady, while not among the very oldest of her sex residing in the county, has, nevertheless long been a citizen of Pike county. She was born in York District, S.C. on Feb. 26, 1811. With her mother's family, she started to Missouri in the fall of 1830, but wintered in Bedford County, Tennessee and came to Missouri in March the following year. They settled on Buffalo Creek, near the famous Buffalo Springs, and it was here that she married John Basye, on Dec. 1st, 1831.

Mrs. Basye has had 11 children, but four of whom are now living. Since her marriage almost all her life has been spent in Bowling Green, (Mo.) where she is held in high esteem for her many excellent qualities. She has been a member of the Methodist Church since before her marriage and has done much to advance the cause of Christianity in the community of which she has so long been a member. Although she ~~was~~ is now more than 72 years of age, no white hairs are found in her head, which is as black as a raven's wing. Her husband is, perhaps, the oldest living native citizen of Pike Co.

James Hoge, born in Frederick Co., Va. 6-12-1742; died in Pulaski Co., Va. 4-5-1820. married in 1794 to Elizabeth Howe.

" William Hoge, a young man evidently in good circumstances came to America from Musselburg, Scotland about the close of the 17th century on account of religious persecution under the Stewarts. Barbara Hume came in the same ship and she went to live with an uncle in N.Y. Wm. Hoge went to Perth Amboy, N.J. to make himself a home. He returned to N.Y. where he married Barbara Hume and he removed from Perth Amboy to Delaware then to Cumberland Valley, Penna. Here his eldest son John Hoge founded Hogestown, Pa. William Hoge found not his resting place here; though advanced in years he ~~remained~~ moved to Frederick Co., Va. on the Opequon branch of the Potomac. Here he gave land for the Opequon Church, school land and burying ground. The Opequon Church was the first place of worship in the valley of Virginia. Wm. Hoge's son James also moved from Pa. to Va. and was married twice. His son Jas. Jr. left his father's home in Frederick Co., Va. and returned to Cumberland Co., Pa. to search for his brother John who was supposed to have joined Braddock's army and to have been killed at Duquesna. He did not find his brother but found a wife and home. He fought with the Penna. troops in the War of the Revolution in Capt. Wm. Hendrick's Company. He enlisted in 1775, and was captured in the expedition against Quebec in 1776. After the war he returned to Va. and established his home at Pulaski where he is buried.
