Dear Bill,

To our knowledge the family of John Poe cannot be found in the 1850 census of Alabama or Arkansas. This census would have given his age. Land grants show he entered land in Arkansas about 1852 (my notes are at home and I am at the store.) Do you think that John Poe stopped in Tenn. or Miss. for a year or two before moving to Arkansas.

I am a descendent of the Poe family on both Mothers and Dads Family. John Poe son William Poe married Reynolds, Their son William Elkins Poe married Elizabeth Holiman and from their your Grandgather and my Mother were brothers and sisters.

On Dads side of the family Simon B. Poe married Lucy Hardin, their daughter married James Walton(my Grandaather). There were several Simon Poe's in Alabama and Arkansas. Simon and John were distant relatives.

The Hogue Family (your great grandmothers line) has been traced back to Col. Samuel Watson of York, South Carolina. My sister , Maurine, joined the D.A.R. on this line. I do not have all the dates but the line goes as follows: Sam Watson, His son Hugh, Hugh's daughter married Ezekiel Hogue; their daughter married Joshua Holiman; their daughter married William E. Poe.

Did you get a copy of Bertha Byrd's History of the Holiman Family. I think I gave your mother a copy but I am not sure. Havent seen your Mother of Dad lately. Hope that I can find some information that will help you in your search of the family roots.

You mentioned that Alfred was Fred Threet's first child; Do you know any of the other children? Do you have evidence that Alfred was Wred's Child?

The 1784 Special State Census of North Carolina shows: Miles Thweat, a white male between 21 and 60. In his house were 3 white females and 4 black males under 16 or over 50. They were in North Hampton Co., Page 110, Capt. Vincent's

Frederick Threet was in warren Co., a white male between 21 and 60 with 3 white females and 4 black males under 16 or over 50 Shadrick Thewitt was on p. 137 of Surry Co. a white male between 21 and 60 with 1 white male under 21 or over 60 and no blacks, Also 3 white females.

In the 1790 Census of the Cheraw District of South Carolina: Page 49

Fredrick Threet John Threet 1 Miles Threet Males over 16 Males Under 16 Females

In the 1800 Census of Chesterfiedd Co. So. Carolina Frederick Threat is listed but there are no numbers beside his name John Threet is listed 42010 00110 00. (7 white males, 2 white females)

In the 1810 Census of South Cgrolina Evan, John Sr. and Miles Thweat are in Chesterfield Co.. John is in Newberry Co.

In 1820 The Threet heads of house in South Carolina are Edward, Evin, Green, John, and Miles.

My Evan B. Threat (Ereat-Great-Grandfather) was born in Sou. Car. about 1803. I do not know of his relationship to the above nor the relationship of the above to one another. Can you help me?

At least two of my Great-Crandfather's Brothers were in Texas before 1900. D.C. may be one of their descendants.

I am nearly sure that Your Sarah and my Ewan were close kin. I have several Alfreds and Sarah Threets in my line. There can be no certain tying of our lines together until we find somebody or something that can tell us the relationship of the early Threets to each other.
