Claim of Widow for Pension, under the Provisions of Sections 4736 to 4740 inclusive Revised Statutes, and the Act of March 9, 1878.

On this 8 day of April, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and Seventy eight personally appeared before me, a County Judge Perry Co Ill., the same being a Court of Record within and for the county and State aforesaid, (1) Mary J. Powe aged 46 years, a resident of DuQuoin, in the State of Illinois, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is a widow of (2) William R. Powe deceased, who was the identical (3) William R. Powe, who served under the name of (4) William R. Powe as a (5) Private in the company commanded by Captain [unclear] in the regiment of [unclear], commanded by [unclear] in the war of 1812; that her said husband (6) [unclear] at [unclear] on or about the [unclear] day of [unclear], A. D. [unclear], for the term of [unclear], and continued in actual service in said war for the term of (7) [unclear], and whose services terminated, by reason of (8) Peace declared at New Orleans, on the [unclear] day of [unclear], A. D. [unclear]. She further

states that the following is a full description of her said husband at the time of his enlistment, viz: (9) With perfect in hair dark eyes gray complexion hair given from best recollection

She further states that she was married to the said (William R. Powe, at the city (or town) of Buchanan County, in the county of Buchanan, and in the State of Missouri, on the 29th day of April

A. D. 1849, by one (10) Mrs. Sanders J. P., who was a (11) Justice of the Peace and that her name before her said marriage was (Mary J. Dale; and she further states

that (12) her said husband (William R. Powe) was previously married to a Mrs. Brown, and that is was her first marriage

and that her said husband (13) William R. Powe, died at DuQuoin, in the State of Illinois, on the 22 day of January, A. D. 1868; and she further

declares that the following have been the places of residence of herself and her said husband since the date of his discharge from the Army, viz: (14) in the State of Missouri, State of Indiana and then to the State of Illinois where her said husband (William R. Powe) died

She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the pension to which she may be entitled under the provisions of Sections 4736 to 4740 inclusive Revised Statutes, and the Act of March 9, 1878, and hereby constitutes and appoints with full powers of substitution and revocation (D. S. White of DuQuoin

Perry Co Ills, her true and lawful attorney, to prosecute her claim, and she further declares that she has heretofore made no application for (15) Pension and that there was a Land warrant issued of a 160 Acres to said Powe

and that her residence is No. [unclear] street, city (or town) of DuQuoin

county of Perry Co, State of Illinois, and that her post-office address is DuQuoin Perry Co Illinois
